<p>Public Health Standard – Prevent Epidemics and the Spread of Disease</p>	<p>Vander Plas handed out the YTD Communicable Disease rates in Sioux County. The state is now investigating all campylobacter cases. FY 12 school-based clinics will be offering the MCV4 since the regulations have changed recently.</p>	<p>Printed handouts on file.</p>
<p>Public Health Standard-Protect Against Environmental Hazards</p>	<p>Julius had no report on any hazards. He has received a notice from the DNR about a private owner sewer issue. The Environmental Health Committee is working on developing policies and updating the nuisance complaint forms and is meeting 1-2 times per month. The goal is to have all policies and procedures complete and to put nuisance complaint forms on the website for the public to use.</p>	
<p>Public Health Standard-Prevent Injuries</p>	<p>Vander Plas reported that the National Public Health Week theme was "Live Injury Free." CHP sent out injury prevention toolkits to local businesses and aired PSA's on local radio stations. CHp participated in the Orange City Area Health System Family Safety Fair with Tobacco and Lead booths.</p>	


<p>Public Health Standard-Promote Healthy Behaviors</p>	<p>Vander Plas updated the Board on Grant dollars awarded recently. The American Heart Association awarded dollars that will be used toward to promote heart health within the Latino community. CHP was awarded a Community Wellness Grant to promote and support breast feeding, but the funding was not given due to budget cuts.</p> <p>The I-Walk project was a collaboration between the Coalition for a Healthy Sioux County, Hull Christian School, and ISU Extension to do a community assessment of safe and walkable routes to school with adults and children in the town of Hull. The results will be presented to Hull City Council.</p> <p>The Coalition for a Healthy Sioux County is meeting monthly and the recent newsletter was distributed. The Latina Health Coalition was recently recognized for being only one a few of its kind in the state. Public Health Standard-Prepare for, Respond to, and Recover from Public Health Emergencies	<p>Vander Plas shared that the H1N1 FY11 activities will be completed at the end of July. FY12 requirements will be met by a drive-thru flu clinic in October 25 at Pella Corporation in Sioux Center. We will still offer regular community flu clinics. Additional H1N1 funding was received and new technological equipment was purchased.</p>	
Public Health Standard-Public Health Organizational Capacity	<p>Protect Against Environmental Health – Vander Plas handed out and reviewed the Environmental Hazards Standard, revised in June. Vander Plas also handed out information on the IDPH Environmental Health Division. Discussion followed. Staff are working on the FY11 Annual Report for the next meeting.
